## Message from the Deputy Principal

This year has been tough for many students, particularly around building positive friendships with such a disruptive year. Term 4 is going to be about creating situations such as whole school events and activities where opportunities to build friendships can take place. It is important we foster these friendships and end the year on a positive note.

Another focus for Term 4 is around ensuring students feel confident to approach teachers if they are feeling unsafe around other students. My concern this year has been the use of the word 'snitch'; it is incredibly upsetting and disappointing, not just as a teacher, but as a parent to hear that students who are experiencing bullying type behaviour don't feel they can tell their teacher or caregiver. This word is not okay to use and certainly has no place in our school.

We have zero tolerance for this type of behaviour and with your help and communication we can ensure it has no place at Ponsonby Intermediate.

During the holidays, it would be greatly appreciated if you can have a conversation with your child around making sure that if things are not going well at school and they feel unsafe, the right thing to do is ask an adult for help.

I would also encourage a holiday with as little social media and device time as possible. We have dealt with a number of incidents involving social media that are happening outside of school and I think a break might just be what the students need.

## Art Exhibition

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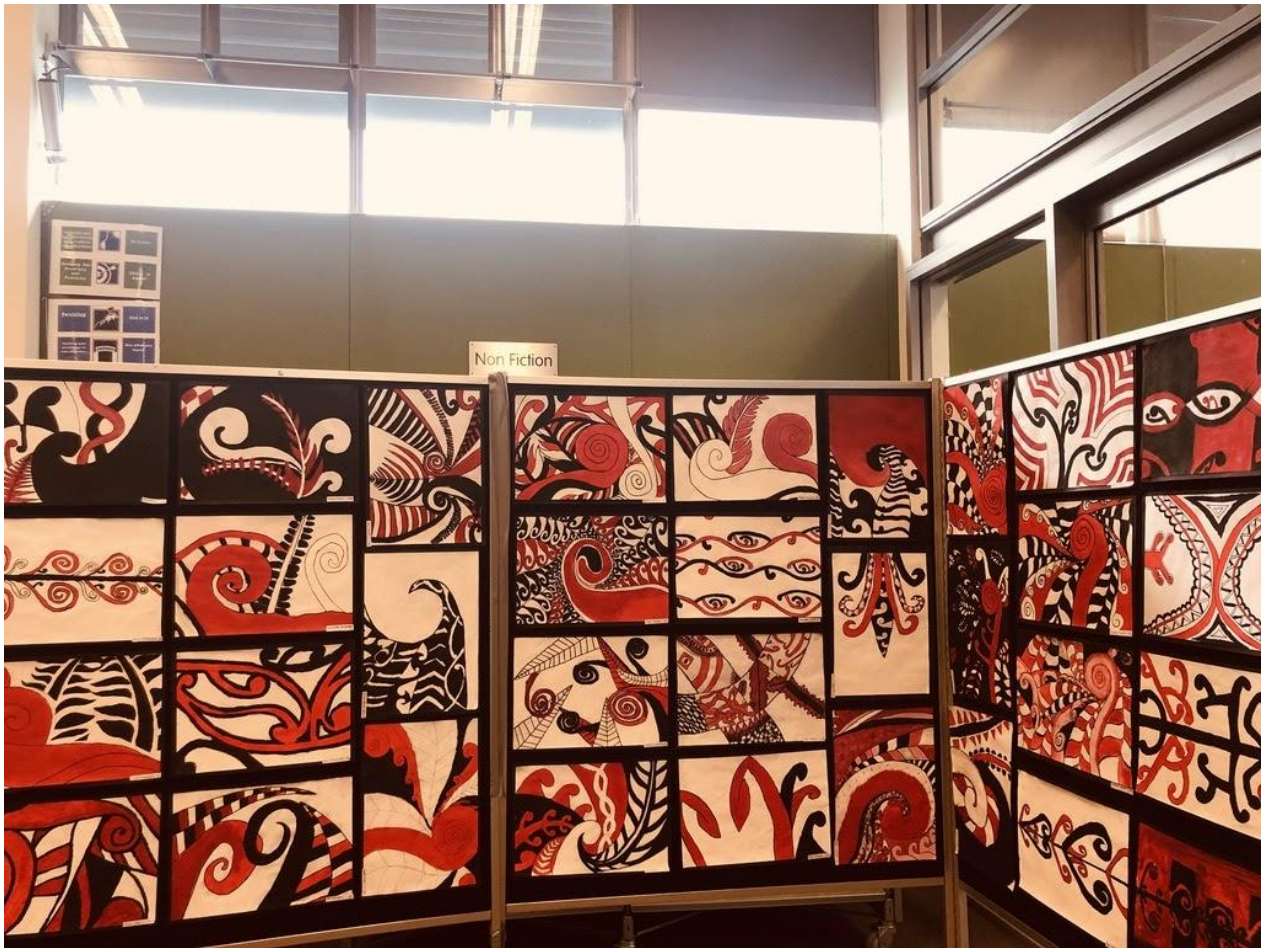
