Principal's Message


In recent weeks the media all over Aotearoa have been discussing Year 8 Maths data. The Ministry of Education has been tasked with a Maths Curriculum refresh and the implementation date has been brought forward a year, to the start of 2025.

Here at Ponsonby Intermediate our specialist Maths teachers have always taught all strands of the curriculum (Number, Measurement, Geometry, Algebra and Statistics) as well as using Pr1me – a world class Maths programme, based on the top-performing Singapore and Korean curriculums. *Pr1me* utilises real life practical applications to problem solving.

I share with you below the Maths achievement data for all Ponsonby Intermediate students at the end of 2023.

We use PAT and e-asTTle testing which provides reliable data and are the recommended tools the current Minister is endorsing.

90% of Ponsonby Intermediate students are at or above standard.




Year 7-8 boys - Zach Holmes 7th, Kobe Walbran-Simon 13th.



Dear Parents and Caregivers

The following message posted on the Neighbourly website was brought to our attention. We spoke with our students about it earlier today.

Contaminated Iollies

The Team from Neighbourly.co.nz

A white lolly brought into a drug checking clinic in Auckland was found to contain a potentially lethal amount of methamphetamine.

What you need to know:

The lolly was in Rinda pineapple wrapping.

- It contained approximately 3g of methamphetamine, which is up to 300 regular doses.
- Consuming this much methamphetamine is extremely dangerous and could result in death.
- The Ministry of Health are unsure how widespread these contaminated lollies are, so we recommend not eating them.
- It is understood the lollie was in a sealed package that was donated to the Auckland City Mission and that some lollies may have been distributed to people in food parcels.
- People who have consumed them reported an unpleasant chemical taste.

If you or someone you know has eaten one and feels unwell, call 111 immediately. Symptoms might include:

- Chest pain
- A racing heart
- Seizures
- Hyperthermia
- Delirium
- Loss of consciousness
